## Q1 2014 UPDATE FROM HEALTHWELL FOUNDATION PRESIDENT, KRISTA ZODET



As we bid a fond farewell to Old Man Winter and welcome spring, it's time to bring you up-to-date on what's blossoming at HealthWell. After all, people have medical emergencies year round, snow, rain, or shine.

Winter's deep freeze did not stop HealthWell from expanding our ability to provide critical medical treatments to men, women and children who have nowhere else to turn. We launched three new funds and are now providing financial assistance to patients with multiple sclerosis, growth hormone deficiency, and chronic idiopathic urticaria. We also recently reopened several programs that had previously been closed due to lack of funding. The HealthWell Team would like to say thank you to our individual and corporate donors whose generous and continued support made this possible.


Along with the launch and reopening of funds, we continue to implement system enhancements to give our patients and providers direct, uninterrupted access to HealthWell resources. New website messages provide alerts and timely information to our visitors regarding schedules, program updates and online portal instructions. We also established a dedicated Grants inbox (Grants@HealthWellFoundation.org) to reduce call hold times for patients and providers by offering a direct source for their inquiries.

HealthWell is advancing its commitment to meet the changing needs of patients through what we call our Total Patient Care model. We are working to go beyond our trusted financial assistance programs to become a catalyst for creating a broad spectrum of care – from prevention, screening and diagnosis to treatment, recovery, rehabilitation, and advocacy. In March, HealthWell hosted a panel discussion focusing on Total Patient Care at the 15th Annual CBI Patient Assistance & Access Programs conference in Baltimore, Maryland, featuring "Total Patient Care" partners like American Well and Buzzy. In addition, we continue to use our sponsored blog, RealWorldHealthCare.org, as our online nerve center for featuring partners like these that are already working successfully to increase access, lower costs, or improve compliance.

May is Lupus Awareness Month. Did you know that The Lupus Foundation of America estimates that there are approximately 1.5 million Americans and more than five million people worldwide living with a form of lupus? Lupus is a serious autoimmune disease in which the body's immune system attacks and destroys healthy tissue. The disease can affect many parts of the body including the skin, heart, lungs, kidneys, brain, and joints.

Since the launch of our Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE) Fund in the fall of 2011, HealthWell is proud to have assisted more than 1,000 people living with lupus in accessing critical, life-changing medications they need to manage their disease and live healthier lives. children start or continue critical medical treatments. While we carefully consider each and every request for assistance and we wish we could say "yes" to every family that comes to us, funding is limited - we're always in need of more <u>donations</u> so that we can help more families, and we welcome your support. As with all HealthWell funds, families must meet standard income and insurance <u>eligibility</u> criteria to qualify for a grant. Grant applications are reviewed by committee on a bi-monthly basis and are awarded on a case by case basis. Here are a few facts to keep in mind when applying for a PAF grant:

- Pre-approval letters will be sent upon review of the information collected during the screening process and once eligibility has been determined. Applicants are given 30 days to provide the required documentation as listed in the pre-approval letter.
- Approval letters are sent after all required documentation is received and approved; this letter will also include the grant amount.
- All reimbursements are made directly to the provider or insurer.
   We do not reimburse any payment for this fund directly to patients or parents.
- Pharmacy cards are not provided for this fund.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

## CHECK OUT THE DISEASES AND MEDICATIONS LIST BEFORE APPLYING

While we make every effort to keep our funds open as long as possible, we are often faced with having to close funds due to limited financial resources. We recognize that all of our funds are critical to our patients, and we continue to seek resources even after we have made the difficult decision to close a fund. We encourage you to check our list of <u>Diseases and Medications</u> regularly as we reopen funds as quickly as possible once additional financial resources become available to us. Before applying for a grant, please be sure to check the list to see whether we have a fund open for your specific disease state and whether your medication is covered under the fund.

### **DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT MEDICARE?**
